Dear Emma:

I was delighted to hear from you and to learn that you and your children and grandchildren are getting along fine. Word had not reached me that Gordon had died, and I was certainly sorry to hear of this.

Enclosed are several pages (all the information that I have) relating to the genealogy of our family which I trust you will find helpful. The first page came from Mrs. F. C. Ricks, who gave me this copy in 1973, and this begins with the birth of John Hall, Sr. in 1771. As best I can decipher the top line on this page, it reads: "The price of this Book was \$10.00 town of Nashville in year 1815 by me John Hall of Dickson County and the state of Tennessee".

Any additional information that you might have will be gratefully received by me, as I too am interested in our genealogy.

My father compiled most of the information enclosed herewith, except for the first page above referred to, and I think most of it came from his memory and from the family bible, which I have.

With reference to the family bible, the front and back covers have separated from the main part of the bible, and the inside pages have greatly deteriorated.

I have contacted people who re-work these old books, and they all want to put new covers on the front and back. In my way of thinking this would destroy to a large extent the value of the bible. I am still looking for someone who will rework it using the old covers, and I think I have a lead to such a person.

I have two children and 5 grandchildren. Toxey lives here in Canton and is with us in our business. He has two adopted children, a boy 10, and a girl 9. Neal lives in Winona, Miss., and is married to a lawyer by the name of John M. Sumner.

They have three children - a boy 13, a girl 12, and a boy 10. All are apparently in good health.

I am in pretty good health except for rheumatoid arthritis which has affected most joints in my body varying in degrees. I have an artificial hip and an artificial knee, with another knee operation scheduled for around the first of November. I am still up and going and battling every day to avoid getting into the condition Uncle Wesley Hall was in before his death. At this stage, I am not in nearly as bad condition as he was in, and, in fact, I play golf 3 or 4 times a week, much more for therophy than for a good score.

My wife, Mary Neal, is in excellent health except for an inner ear problem which causes dizziness on occasions. She has been going to Dr. Shea in Memphis who is supposed to be the top ear specialist in this part of the country, and he seems to have helped her some, although the problem has not been eliminated.

As previously stated, the enclosed is all the information I have, and when your study is completed, I trust you will advise me of your findings.

FAMILY RECORD

Wesley White Hall was born March 8, 1819, and died Aug. 21, 1886, at Meridian, Miss., and is buried at Long Creek Baptist Church 7 miles East of Meridian. He was first married to Matilda C. Ezell, August 30, 1838, and she died Sept. 20, 1841, and is buried in Alabama. His second marriage was to Amanda Sarah Eastis, Nov. 24, 1842, and she died Jan. 4, 1881 and is buried at Salem Baptist Church about 17 miles North East of Meridian.

Three children were born to Wesley White Hall and Amanda Sarah Eastis Hall, as follows: Joseph J. Hall, Wesley White Hall, Jr., and Lattimore Hall, who died at the age of 18, unrarried.

After the death of Amanda Sarah Hall, Wesley White Hall married his third wife, Maggie E. Hill, on April 2, 1881, and they had no children.

Amanda Sarah Eastis Hall was born February 9, 1826.
Maggie E. Hill Hall is buried at Sucalena, Miss., in Lauderdale County.

Wesley White Hall was reared about 3 miles east of Meridian. He was a farmer and owned and operated a water grist mill and a part of the present Meridian water supply comes from the old mill pond on his old home place. He was elected Representative from Lauderdale County and introduced the bill in the Mississippi Legislature incorporating the City of Meridian.

William Wright was born December 12, 1801 and died July 10, 1878; he was married to Lucinda Robinson in 1829; she was born Sept. 13, 1815 and died October 25, 1872, and the following children were born to them at Opelika, Ala.

Sarah Wright (Dennis) who died at Rawls Springs, Miss., in August, 1892.

Toxey Hall of Columbia, Miss. Marion County. District Attorney of the Fifteenth Judicial District of Miss. was born September 18, 1882, at Chunkey, Lauderdale Co. He is the son of Dr. Wesley White Hall and Julia Emma (Wright) Hall of Meridian, Miss.; and of Opelika, Ala. His father was a native of Meredian, near which city he practised medicine for some four years, thence remmoving to Rose Hill, Jasper County, where he continued his profession for several years, after which he removed to Estabuchie, Jones County where he remained for six years, and moved to Lumberton in Lamar County, where after a practice extending over three years, he died in 1902. He was a graduate of Mobile Medical College. He was the son of Colonel Wes ley White Hall and Sarah Amanda Eastis, who lived near Meridian, Miss. Col. W. W. Hall represented Lauderdale County in the Legislature during two terms, just before or during the Civil War.

Mr. Hall's mother was the daughter of William Wright and Lucinda Robinson who lived at Opelika, Ala. from which place the family removed to Miss., where it has since resided. He received his early education in the Poplarville High School and graduated in May, 1902, from this institution, which under the leadership of Prof. W. I. Thames, one of the strongest, best equipped and most influential educators in Miss., became noted for its strict discipline. Mr. Hall attended Miss. College during sessions of 1902-03-04, winning the Junior medal for oratory in 1904, and representing the Hermenian Literary Society as second orator, on its 1904 anniversary. He attended the University of Miss. during sessions of 1905, and graduated from the Law Department of Millsaps College in 1906, with degree of B. L.

Mr. Hall Immediately located at Columbia, Miss., where he has been a busy and useful attorney thoroughly ide ntified with the best interest of his chosen residence. During 1909 and 1910, he served as Mayor of the City of Columbia and was elected District Attorney for the Fifteenth Judicial District, in 1911; was re-elected in 1915, by a vote of three to one and is one of the best equipped officials in the public life of the State.

Mr. Hall is a life-long Democrat; since 1900, a member of the Baptist Church; was in 1910, Worshipful Master of St. Albans Lodge, No.80, Free and Accepted Masons; a member of the Woodman of the World and, in June, 1909, was a delegate to the Sovereign Camp W.O.W.at Detroit, Mich; is also a member of the Knights of Pythias. .

On October 25,1911, Judge Hall was married to Pearl Ethel Watts, daughter of John Watts and Domer (Tyrone) Watts of Columbia, Miss.


